Annual Report of MAITRI Centre's 1st June 2019 – 31st May 2020

Programmes <u>Health, National</u> Leprosy Elimination

Our collaboration with the *State Health Services* has been ongoing since 1989, requiring monthly reports to the *District Leprosy Officer* (DLO) for the leprosy eradication programme. Since 2002 continues our involvement in the integration process with the assistance to the government staff at the Primary Health Centres (PHCs) in the entire district (24 provinces – 3,151 villages, population 5,236,718) in the verification and management of *new cases*, which in the past 12 months have amounted to 402. Since 2003 overall 15,347 new cases.

Regarding the **Prevention of Deformities** (POD) programme, in 12 months assessed **284 high risk cases**, instructed **602** *disabled cases* for *self-care*, trained *405 deformed patients*, *5,046 community members*, and *120 government staff members*. In 14 years overall **17,490**, **16,651**, **17,152**, **49,352** and **5,589** respectively. Particularly valuable to the District Health Services our *POD camps* at the government PHCs with distribution of *sandals* and *dressing kits:* in 12 months held 7 camps, distributed *110* pairs and *415* kits.

Health Awareness programme continues along with the above activities as *Information-Education-Communication* (IEC) and *Inter-Personal Communication* (IPC), for which we have covered in 12 months 2,839 villages, touched 1,053,965 people and 36,047 students, carried out wall-paintings in 109 places, and manned our stall for 75 days.

We have also continued our <u>additional assistance</u> as required by the *District Leprosy Officer* (DLO) such as the *monthly collection* of data at the PHCs of **Imamganj**, **Dumaria**, **Dobhi**, **Barachatti and Fatehpur** provinces and the *occasional delivery* of MDT drugs from the State Health Society, Patna, to the District Leprosy Office.

Patients from all over the district seek **temporary** hospitalization at our **hospital**. Since September, 1999 admitted an **overall total** of **1,522** patients : 1,421 ulcer cases, 101 reactions. In 12 months total **34**: 30 and 4 respectively.

Our **shelter** for homeless, deformed patients closed for lack of homeless patients in Gaya District. Previously sheltered **23**.

- Jun.1-Oct.31, 2019: Our **all-year-round booth with display** at prmanent site at Bodhgaya continued its operations in the hot season **byweekly**, i.e. on Saturdays and Sundays, to approach local visitors from all over the district.

- Nov. 1, 2019-Mar 15, 2020: Manning of the booth 3 days/week throughout the winter.

- Jan 26, 2020: Celebrated **World Leprosy Day** with our special health education programme comprising of display of posters, distribution of leaflets, speeches carried out through some provinces by 2 jeeps. Field workers visited 25 villages with population 40,900 and manned Bodhgaya stall all day with the support of our teachers.

- Mar 22-May 31: Manning of the booth suspended due to the lockdown because of Covid-19.

TB Control

Our TB work continues along the same line as during our collaboration with the *State and District Health Services* for the activities under **RNTCP** (*Revised National TB Control Programme*), i.e.

1) In the 10 provinces of Bodhgaya, Mohanpur, Barachatti, Imamganj, Dumaria. Atri, Bathani, Mohra, Fathepur, and Tankuppa through our contacts with ASHAs (government village heath workers) and our **5 sputum collection points.** In 12 months *registered 341*, *released from treatment 179* patients, *sputum tested 421*. *Under treatment 162*, *supplements* and *food* provided to **72** for a minimum of 6 months. Since 1995 overall registered cases **9,234**.

2) Awareness activities carried out in 2,834 villages (1,054,591 people, 36,047 students), wall-paintings in 109 places.

3) In 12 months hospitalized at the **TB Ward 20** very serious patients, since 2008 overall hospitalised **313**, fully recovered **262**.

- *Mar.24, 2020* : Due to lockdown **World TB Day** celebrated only with a procession of our Fulchater School students and teachers through 9 villages (population 7,010).

Still awaiting response from the District TB Officer, Gaya, to our application for collaboration with the government health services within the RNTCP.

Child Immunization

Terminated.in January, 2016.

Various, Institutional

Mother and Child Care

In view of the continuing poverty among the lower castes, stepped up our activites for both programmes, which are carried out in 3 provinces with clinics twice a week, i.e. 1 mobile and 1 at the Centre's OPD.

1) **Pre- and post-natal care**: - for <u>pre-natal</u> care in 12 months **318 new expectant mothers** have attended our clinics for monthly check-up by our doctor and to receive **supplements**, **anti-tetanus vaccination**, **iodised salt**, and other required assistance. At present **under treatment 135**;

in 12 months **171** *new-born* babies (92 females + 79 males; 8 twins) thus since 1997 **overall total 7,259 women registered** and **5,574 babies born**, including 53 pairs of twins;

- for <u>post-natal</u> care commenced in January, 2017 special care for **weak and anaemic mothers** at our weekly clinics, where they receive medical care and **supplements** and in some cases provision of **pulses**. So far **treated 121**.

2) Mainly below 5 years of age, the children treated under *child care* are mostly female, in the 1st year of life, affected by severe malnutrition and neglect. We provide *milk and supplements* and other care. In the past 12 months register-ed **298** *children*. Under treatment **163**. **Overall registered** and cared for **3,866 children**, **restored to health 3,241**.

Treated for general ailments **1,085 children** between 2 and 5 years of age.

Since October, 2014 our outreach includes girls age 6 to 14 to address their health issues particularly related to undernourishment and anaemia. In addition since 2017 we have been distributing *sanitary napkins* to our under treatment patients for a token amount of Rs5/pack. In the past 12 months registered **132 girls**, overall registered **734 girls**, who have been receiving *supplements* and in some cases *legumes*.

Birth Control

In addition to the personal advice provided to women at our mother care clinics, currently a campaign has been run aimed at poorer families in the villages involved in our leprosy, TB, and mother and child care programmes. In 12 months succeeded in having *102* women undergo tubectomy at the Primary Health Centres of 3 provinces. Since 2007 **overall operated 1,323 women**.

In 12 months covered **147** *families* and addressed **2,105** *family members*. Since 2003 overall covered **1,770** *families* with **40,237** *family members*.

Physical Rehabilitation

Pending the *reconstructive surgery* of **7** *disabled leprosy patients* due to the uncertainty related to the availability of hospitals recognized by the State of Bihar. This is required for the grant of Rs8,000..

Since 1993 total of 101 rehabilitated including 9 children for various types of disabilities, 1 of whom was a cleft lip and palate case.

HIV/AIDS Awareness

Continues the *health education programme* in interior villages aimed at the families of migrant workers and along the Grand Trunk road linking Delhi to Calcutta mainly aimed at truck drivers.

In 12 months covered **55** villages and **35,240** population, with direct health education imparted to **285** persons, and addressed **135** truck drivers. Distributed **310** packs of condoms provided by the government health services.

In 14 years overall covered 2,976 villages with 1,501,801 population, educated 32,135 persons, and addressed 6,965 truck drivers. Distributed 12,516 packs of condoms.

Educational Programmes

Primary Education in Schools

On account of the unsatisfactory level of the government schools up to 5th grade continues our 21 year long partnership with the villagers of **Fulchatar Village** while the *school committee* duly maintains the buildings of the *Village School.* - *Dec.10, 2019:* Held mid year tests for all classes with the attendance of **145** pupils.

- Mar. 19-23: End of year exams of all **145** pupils (none dropped out) with outstanding <u>regular</u> attendance in all 5 grades in both formal and non-formal classes followed by supplementary tests. **Promoted 33.**

- Mar. 24,: Participation of the pupils of MAITRI's school in the celebration of **World TB Day** with processions through 9 villages (population 7,010) exhibiting posters and chanting slogans drawn and written by the pupils.

- Apr. 1: **Overall total** of pupils enrolled for the new school year 2019-20, **145** with no new registrations. However classes suspended due to the Covid pandemic.

- May 7. : Cancelled the annual **early morning procession** to the Bodhgaya Main Temple and all other events for the celebration of the **2564th Buddha Jayanti** due to the Covid pandemic.

Adult Literacy

Re-started and re-suspended the Hindi and English literacy classes for MAITRI staff at our premises.

Activities Report 2019-2020

Water Resources & Afforestation

No installation of deep boring tube-wells due to the Covid lockdowns.

Animal Care

Recognized by the Animal Welfare Board of India (AWBI) in 2008, the programme consists of

1) the **rescuing of animals** since 1993 : in 12 months rescued 7 *dogs* of various ages (4 puppies), 3 *goats, 1 calf.* Died **44** animals. Born 12 *kids*. Our **Animal Shelter** has now **64 dogs** ranging in age from 14 years to 8 months, **15 goats, 6 kids, 1** *horse, 1 mare, 2 fillies, 1 colt, 2 cows, 1 bullock, 3 cocks, 1 tortoise, 1 cat-fish.*

2) Veterinay care provided to 41 pets of the surrounding community. In 16 years overall treated 1,542 animals.

3) Animal Birth Control (*ABC*) programme. In 17 years overall sterilizations 3,671 : 152 shelter dogs, 3,474 stray dogs, 45 other animals.

4) The **large animal care** programme for the treatment of village cattle continues through the service at the OPD. In 15 years overall treated **1,893** cows, bullocks, calves, goats, and others.

- March 9, 2020: Held 1 ABC minicamp with Dr. Deepak Kumar, Vet. Surgeon. Sterilized 9 dogs (6 females).

Charity & Others

Distributed **comfort material**: 775 blankets along with 63 sweaters for children, women, and men, 90 garments (mainly baby clothes, dhotis, sarees), and 1,750 sanitary napkins, food to TB patients, children from 0 to 14 years, aenemic women in our programmes for 6 months (220 patients), and educational material (105 items) to 25 poorer pupils of our village schools. Overall totals 19,354, 6,690, 3,491 respectively.

Provided leprosy patients with **110 pairs of footwear** (overall total 8,890) and **415 dressing kits** (overall total 5,082), plus overall 427 goggles for lagophthalmos patients.

So far enabled 6 underprivileged persons to achieve self-sufficiency.

Suspended long-distance adoption programme. for lack of collaboration from the boy's family.

Special Events & Activities

- Aug. 23-26, 2019: Received the visit of Italian supporter **Ms Chiara Cioncoloni** who visited our Fulchatar school.

- Oct. 28: Celebrated **Deewali**, the Festival of Light, by all of MAITRI's staff and in-patients with the lighting of 1,000 lamps.in the campus.

- Dec. 1, 2019-Jan. 15, 2020 : Biweekly **distribution of blankets** to leprosy, TB, and mother care patients from all over the district, with contribution towards the cost of fare. Funds donated by long-time donours Berliner **Buddhistische Akademie**. - Dec. 20, 2019-Jan. 7, 2020 : Volunteering by old time friend and supporter, Mr **Phil Hunt**, from Australia.

- May 7: Cancelled the annual **early morning procession** to the Bodhgaya Main Temple and all other events for the celebration of the **2564th Buddha Jayanti** due to the Covid pandemic.

Legalities

After completion of the **second arbitration** by the Delhi High Court regarding the construction of MAITRI campus with a **higher award** to MAITRI, the counterpart's **new appeal** is still to be heard.

Still pending some of the civil suits filed by MAITRI at Gaya Court regarding parcels of land inside the property.

Still pending at Patna High Court our **petition** for the recovery of the balance dues from the Government of Bihar.

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Finance

Running Expenses

At present most of the programmes are being funded through general donations and private and institutional grants, the major of which are

- June 1, 2019 - May 31, 2020 : Commenced and completed the utilization of **FPMT Inc.**'s grant 2019-20 for our leprosy and mother & child programmes.

- Feb. 1, 2020 : Commenced the utilization of Chiesa Valdese's grant 2020-21 for our TB care programme.

<u>Investment</u>

Major rehauling of 2 Mahindra jeeps.

Future Projects & Prospects

Continue the **ABC** (**Animal Birth Control**) **programme** to limit the stray dogs' population of Bodhgaya. Continue and expand **water resources** and **afforestation programmes**.

Enlarge the *horses' enclosure*, build a *shed for the cows*, and complete the construction of the *temple* Complete the *final registration* of the balance 1½ acres of land.

Fundraising for all existing and planned projects and programmes. Encourage the setting-up of other *Friends of MAITRI* groups along with seeking of *fundraisers*.



MAITRI: Always Ready to Assist the Needy

The consequences of Covid go well beyond the physiological manifestations of the disease, as the measures taken by governments to contain the contagion have created havoc in all economies. In India after repeated lockdowns since March millions of people and their families are without sustenance, as the earning members of households are jobless. The elderly are particularly hit by the situation, as the government subsidies reach only some occasionally.

Thanks to the fundraising effort of some of MAITRI's trustees, money was donated towards relief efforts and we could thus select the most indigent among the people of our village, Dhandhwa, and provide rations for two months. With joy and gratitude 31 persons came to the centre to collect their rations and it



made us happy to have contributed to the relief of some of the suffering. It however falls within the state administrations' duties to consistently provide for the population in exceptional times like this and we hope that with time regular supplies will be streamlined.
